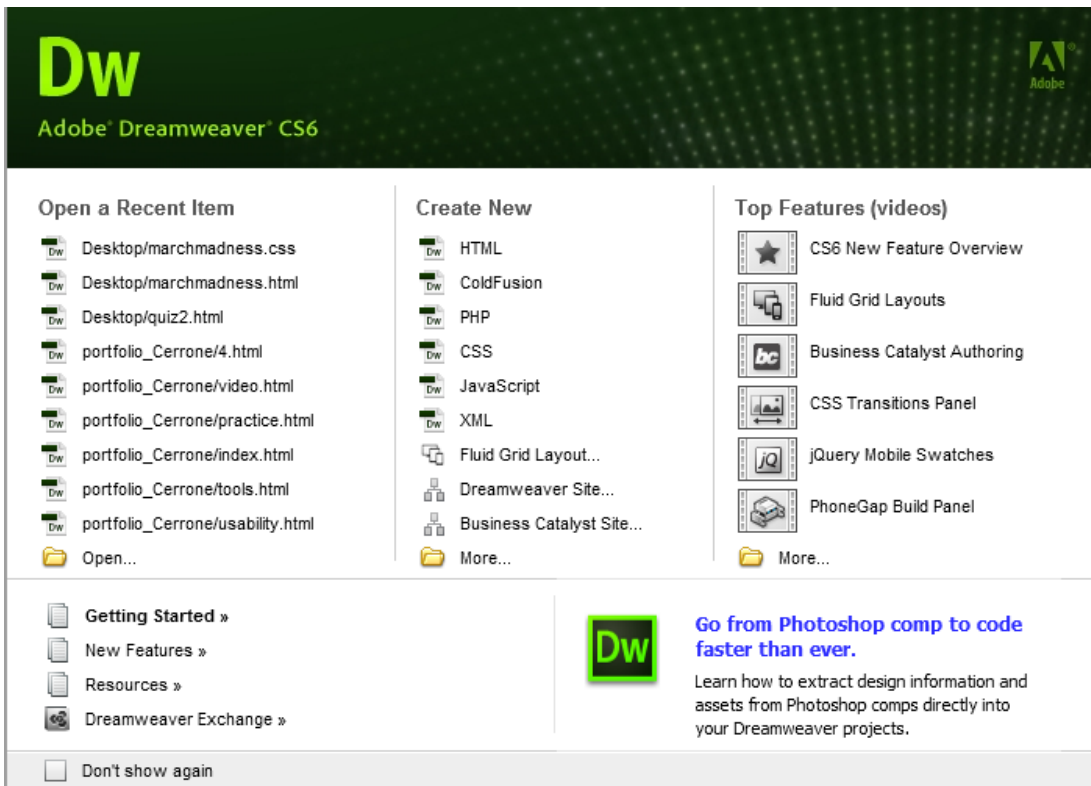
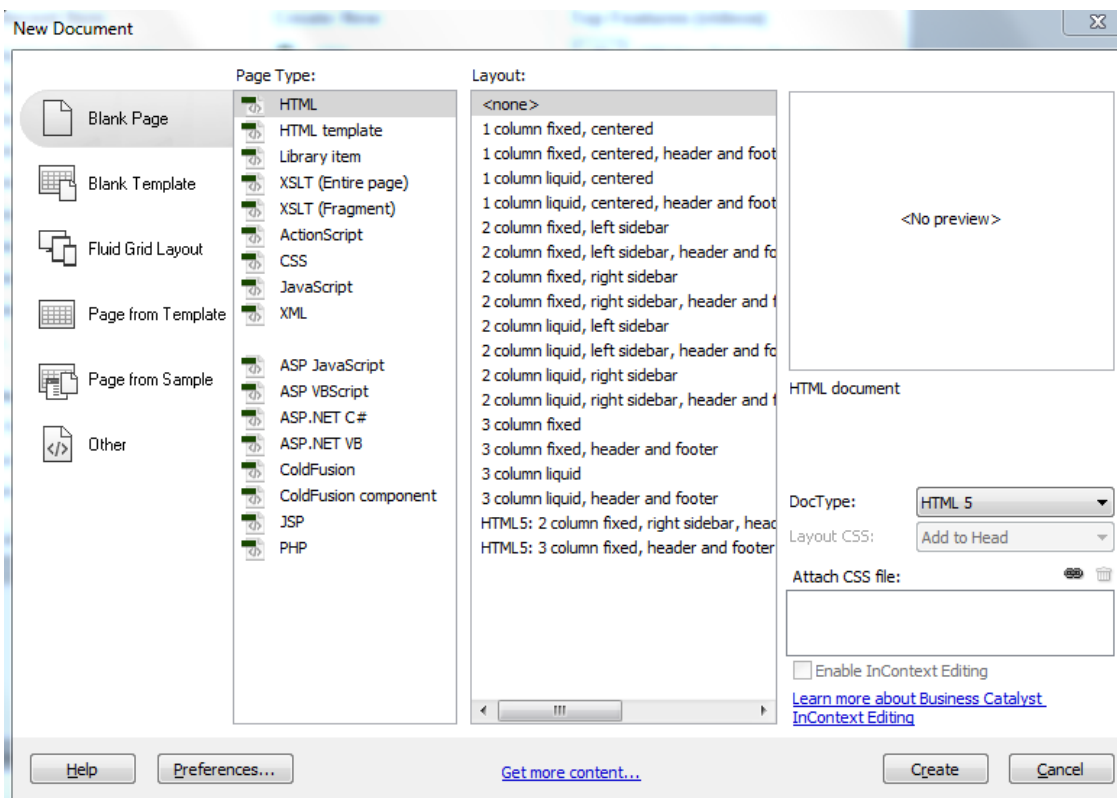


## March Madness Website (starting to use basic CSS)


Step 1: Create a new HTML5 file in Dreamweaver. Click on More in the Create New column.



After clicking More you should get this window. Under DocType choose HTML5.



Your screen should look like...

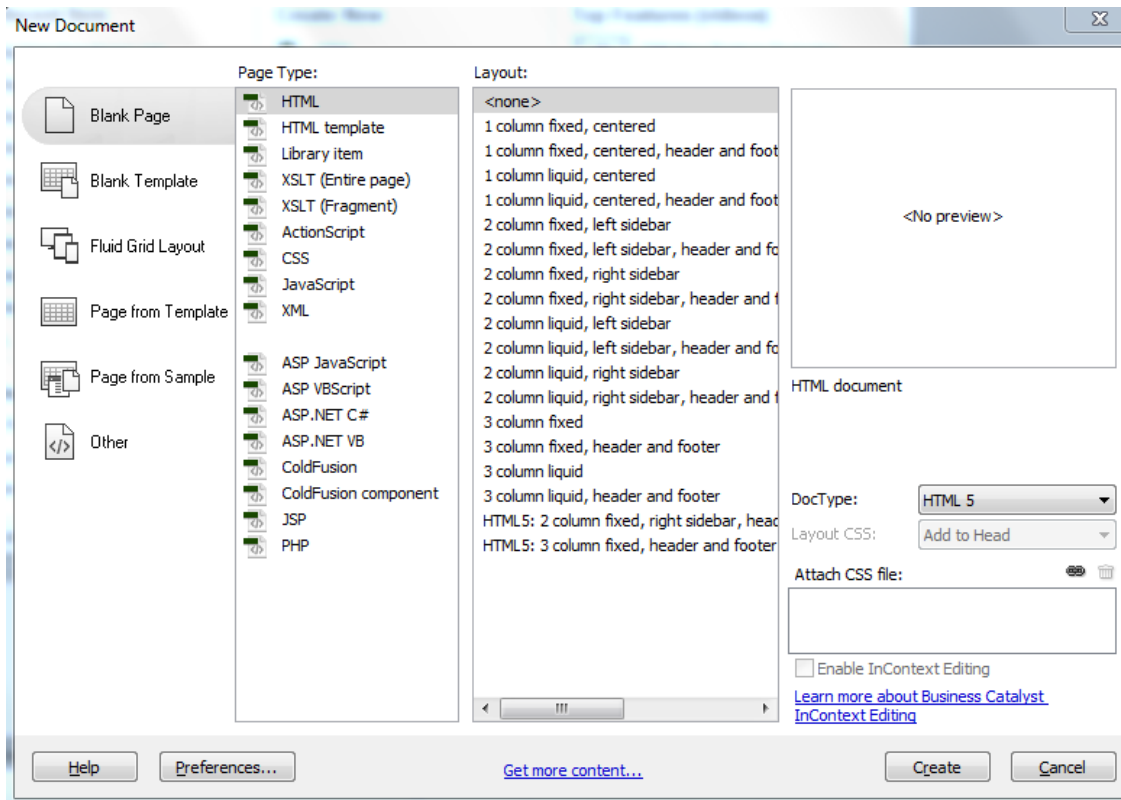

- Save as MarchMadnessLastname.html in your Portfolio folder.

Part II: CSS

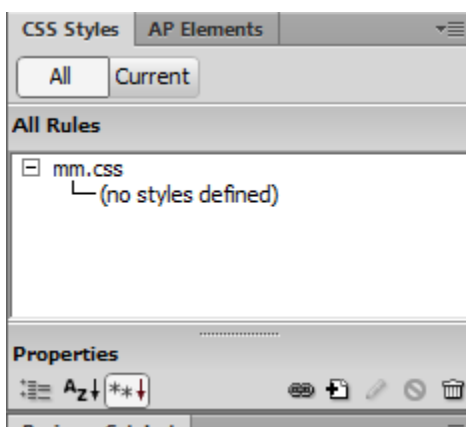
Go to File<New. You should screen like one below. Choose CSS and Create.



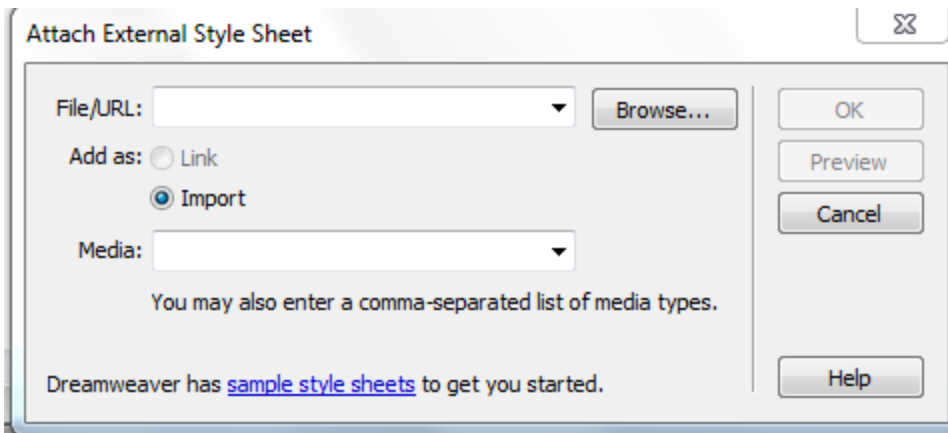
File<Save As<MarchMadness.css in your Portfolio folder. It should just say

@charset "utf-8";
/* CSS Document */
```

Go to Window<CSS Styles. If there is already a check there then you don't have to do anything. You will see a window on the right that looks like the image below. Click on the chain link.



You will get a screen like the one below. Click on Browse and find your CSS file.



You will see a screen that looks like the one below. Notice that the CSS file is now linked with the HTML5 file (source code).



All we are going to do is change the background color of the page in CSS today.

In your CSS file type:

```
body {
background-color: #color you want here;
}
```

Make sure your CSS file is saved and then preview in browser.
